## Background

The Transitions Nurse Program (TNP) is a quality improvement, intense care coordination program, designed to enhance the transitions of care for rural Veterans from a tertiary VA facility back to their VA primary care provider.

TNP has been implemented at 12 VA sites nationally, trained 15 Transitions Nurses and served over 4500 Veterans since 2017.

## TNP Outcomes



A reduced rate of death within 30 days of discharge



More likely to visit their PCP within 14 days of discharge

## TNP

The goal of TNP is to disseminate the intervention nationally using manualized training materials to guide implementation of the intervention and teach the four evidence-based intervention components.

TNP is designed to build local capacity to provide high quality care coordination for high risk rural Veterans transitioning home from a VAMC or transitioning to community nursing homes and other post-acute settings (e.g., home health care, rehabilitation facilities).



TNP is available to both nurses and social workers in care coordination



Standardized training materials are provided to guide program implementation with light touch external facilitation



High-level evaluation of implementation measures, end user satisfaction with training materials, and Veteran and provider satisfaction
